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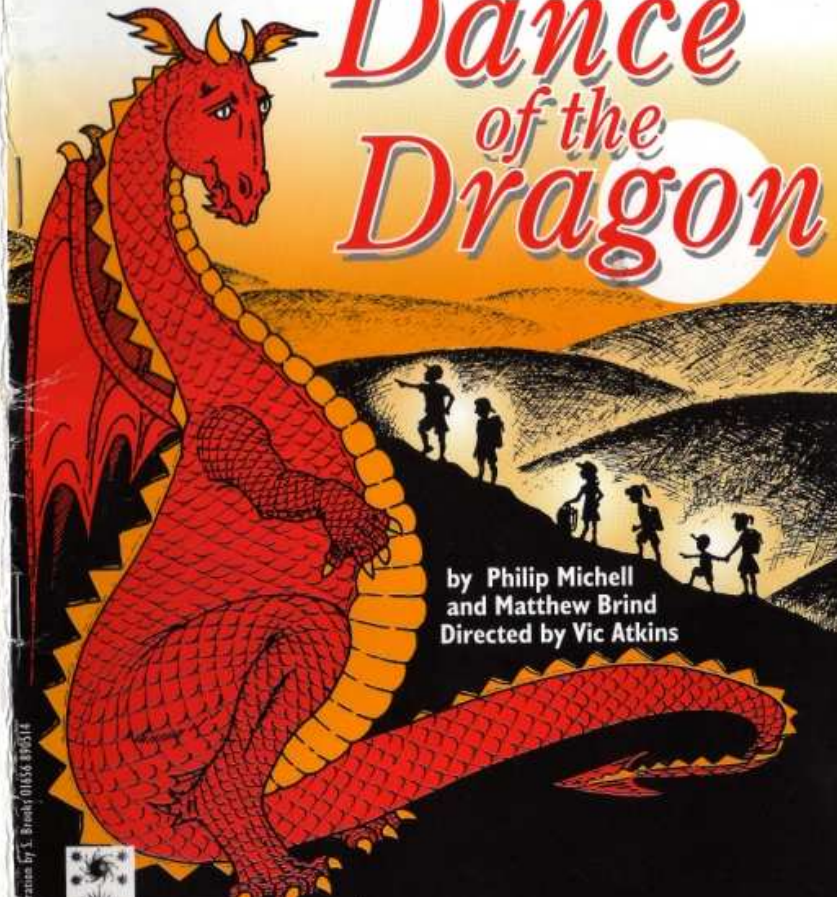

NOTES FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

During the summer of 1999, Matthew and I were commissioned by The Unknown Theatre Company to write a new musical for the Millennium, funded by ACW Millennium Festival Commission the project was to be performed during October 2000.

With a few initial ideas in hand, we embarked on a series of workshops with the company. The first explored working as a team and pooled our knowledge of famous people from Welsh history, legend and literature. We achieved a wide list of Welsh celebrities from the Stereophonics to Neil Jenkins, from Shirley Bassey to Charlotte Church. However, tucked away in the list were also the names of Merlin, King Arthur and his Knights of the Round Table and the tales of the Mabinogion. Not wanting to go for the obvious or to attract lawsuits from characterizing famous sporting stars onstage (!), the Mabinogion fuelled many of the ideas which formed the structure of the show. The second workshop expanded on ideas for the content: a journey, a gallery depicting scenes from Welsh history and the plight of the outsider. The journey remained as the central driving force through the show, the gallery became simply a collection of souls with their guardian curator the Soulcatcher and the outsider is reflected in the character of Marsha. A third workshop looked at choral speaking, which was later developed with Matthew into the opening you see tonight.

Rather than deal with the more headline hitting issues such as drugs and underage pregnancy that are constantly thrown at young people, I wanted the show to be about the fears and doubts we all experience on a daily basis: the courage to work through problems, the strength to stand apart from the expectations of others. As the play developed, it became something of a 'yellow brick road' of discovery for the central characters. Indeed there are echoes from a number of musicals and films present in Dance Of The Dragon, see if you can spot them.

Have you ever been really down, fed up, at the point of despair when you feel you can't do this any more and all you want is to just give up? Yes? Then perhaps you've met the Soulcatcher already! In my original scenario, the Soulcatcher was an evil character who imprisoned unlucky souls. However, as I wrote, she soon grew to become an angel-like figure who looked after our doubts and fears, so that we could live our lives fully and achieve our goals. The Land of Fallen Souls was born. But how would this feature our characters from history, literature and legend? Simply they would appear as almost opposites to the heroes we know. Kings unable to rule, knights without chivalry, poets that can't rhyme and comedians without a sense of humour. Somewhere in the Land Of Fallen Souls, we could probably find the part of Neil Jenkins' soul that can't kick a rugby ball for peanuts - sorry Neil!

So welcome to the bizarre world of the Soulcatcher as we follow Beth, Dean, Jez, Marsha and Rhian on their journey through the Land Of Fallen Souls to find the Fire of the Dragon and a strange boy named Spike! I hope you enjoy the show!
